SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Mr. Jensen talked to the trustees about the board self-evaluation tool. They discussed continuing to use the tool they have been or using the WSSDA BSAS tool Ivan Lorentzen referenced at the FVCC workshops. Mr. Jensen will look into the costs and get back to the board. Mr. Jensen shared the district improvement plan. He explained it will define what we believe as a school and categorize and identify areas for focus. It will create a systematic approach for school improvement. Board discussion followed. Next, Mr. Jensen talked about the general fund levy timeline. The trustee's letter regarding the levy will be in the Bigfork Eagle this week. He talked about the next steps for getting levy information out to the public. There are also open trustee positions. Mr. Jensen mentioned having a question and answer forum for trustee candidates. Lastly, Mr. Jensen told the trustees they have the option of permissively levying funds to match the state Transformational Learning Grant. It will be included as part of the public notice in March regarding permissive levies. Board discussion followed. On the elementary side, the trustees could levy \$66,847 which would cost approximately \$2.94 per year per \$100,000 market value. On the high school side, the trustees could levy \$37,771, which would cost approximately \$1.33 per year per \$100,000 market value.

NEW BUSINESS

A. High School Physics Class Out of State Field Trip Request – Rhonda White asked the board to approve her annual trip to Silverwood. Her physics students wear vests that collect data to use in the classroom. Whitefish High School will share transportation costs and Columbia Falls High School may join as well. There are 4 students going and the approximate costs include \$150 for the tickets and the shared cost of the bus

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Bigfork Schools Planning/Response to Possible Coronavirus Outbreak Superintendent Jensen asked the trustees to consider procedures for a Coronavirus outbreak. He said the school will do what it can to prevent the spread of the virus, have a plan in case of an extended school closure, and a plan for when to re-open after a closure. He explained there is not direction from the county health department or the state at this time regarding school closure. The other consideration at this time is whether to cancel the upcoming Europe field trip.
 - Mr. Appleby spoke about the options EF Tours is providing at this time, which include going on the trip as planned, postponing the trip and canceling the trip and participants will receive EF Tours vouchers. The vouchers are transferable to other people within our school system and could be used for future trips. The current field trip is set to start March 24 with visits to London, Paris and Munich and includes 22 students and 9 adults.

Board discussion followed. Parents, Dan & Denise Mildren and Andrea Goss spoke in favor of going. Dawn Richie spoke in favor of postponement.

Mr. Wielkoszewski suggested the school purchase the vouchers of seniors who may not be able to attend a later trip and have future participants buy them.

After much discussion, the trustees will delay a decision until the board meeting on March 11.

Superintendent Jensen recommended school closure on short notice with positive or presumptive positive test. The county would run their process, which he anticipates would take 3 to 4 days. At that point, depending on the outcome, school would resume or stay canceled.

Mr. Appleby, Mr. Hansen, Superintendent Jensen and Mr. Wielkoszewski showed the trustees what a virtual classroom would look like if there was a school closure. Staff is currently being trained to be ready to teach in a virtual classroom.

Board discussion followed. It was determined Superintendent Jensen will cancel school if a student, or someone in a student's household, tests positive or has a presumptive positive. The county health department will run its procedures and depending on the outcome, school will either resume or stay canceled for a longer period.

Mrs. Mildren asked if a school closure would include athletics. Superintendent Jensen told her it would and that MHSA is monitoring Coronavirus as well.

Parent Jill Welch asked if this will affect the junior class ACT test. Superintendent Jensen said it could.

B. BAEA Retirement Incentive Agreement – Superintendent Jensen told board members he was approached by the union regarding a retirement incentive. He said an incentive is typically done for financial reasons. This would be a curtesy to consider for teachers who may be retiring. The agreement stipulates 4 or more eligible teachers must retire by March 12, 2020 to receive the incentive.

A motion to <u>approve BAEA Retirement Incentive Agreement</u> was made by Trustee Anderson, seconded by Trustee Parish, and approved by unanimous vote of the elementary and high school trustees.

PRINCIPAL REPORTS

Mr. Appleby talked to the board about a recent celebration assembly and about Principal Advisory Teams.

Mr. Hansen also talked about Principal Advisory Teams, the upcoming Career Fair and ACTs on April 7. Mrs. Carter was selected by community members for the first teacher of the month award.

Superintendent Jensen told trustees the district has been invited to speak at the state level regarding transformational learning.

Mr. Porrovecchio reported on winter sports, and upcoming spring sports. He thanked Paul Wallin and Mike Bonner for their years of coaching tennis.
