There were no comments on non-agenda items.

A motion to <u>approve the agenda</u> was made by Trustee Relyea, seconded by Trustee Whitney, and **approved** by unanimous vote of the elementary school and high school trustees.

Trustee Relyea asked Mrs. White what she planned to spend the Montana Masonic Foundation donation on. Mrs. White will make purchases from BioRad and Gilson for her classroom.

A motion to <u>approve the consent agenda</u> was made by Trustee Whitney, seconded by Trustee Relyea, and **approved** by unanimous vote of the elementary and high school trustees.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Mr. Jensen talked to the board about the April 8 board meeting. Trustee Parish picked session 5, which left session 6 for Trustee Elwell. Trustee candidates will be invited and the plan is to do a board overview and a question and answer session. Mr. Jensen proposed a board meeting on April 20. Trainers will be on campus that day and would attend the board meeting to talk to the board. Next he talked about the levy timeline. Board discussion followed regarding the levy funds and communicating the majority of the levy funds would go to salaries and benefits.

Community member Norah Morrison asked for clarification regarding accreditation standards. Mr. Jensen told her the district doesn't meet accreditation for administrative staff and is over in other areas.

OLD BUSINESS

A. Bigfork School Planning/Response to Possible Coronavirus Outbreak – Mr. Jensen confirmed trustees are still comfortable with the plan to close school if a student or staff member or someone in their immediate household tests positive. School would close while the county health department investigates and then we would determine how to proceed. The trustees, Mr. Jensen and Mr. Appleby discussed the upcoming Europe field trip.

A motion to <u>postpone the March 2020 Europe trip until spring break 2021</u> was made by Trustee Martinz, seconded by Trustee Relyea and approved with affirmative votes from Trustees Parish, Whitney, Martinz and Relyea. Trustee Sandry opposed.

The board discussed purchasing trip vouchers from the senior students and their parents with the intent to sell them

to students and parents next year. Estimated cost to purchase 8 student vouchers and 4 parent vouchers was \$45,000.

A motion to <u>purchase 8 senior student vouchers and 4 senior parent vouchers</u> was made by Trustee Relyea, and seconded by Trustee Martinz and approved with affirmative votes from Trustees Parish, Whitney, Martinz and Relyea. Trustee Sandry opposed.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Addition of Elementary Curriculum Teacher (Early Kindergarten Classroom Addition) – Mrs. Clarke asked the board to consider adding an additional early kindergarten classroom due to the success of the existing early kindergarten program and the waiting list the school has each year. It takes approximately 10 kids to pay for itself. Space would be identified at a later time.

A motion to <u>approve the addition of Elementary Curriculum Teacher</u> was made by Trustee Whitney, seconded by Trustee Relyea, and approved by unanimous vote of the elementary trustees.

B. Bigfork Elementary School Levy Election Resolution – Lacey Porrovecchio asked the trustees to approve the elementary levy election resolution including the amount of the general fund levy, \$331,625.12.

A motion to <u>approve the Bigfork Elementary School Levy Election Resolution</u> was made by Trustee Relyea, seconded by Trustee Whitney, and approved by unanimous vote of the elementary trustees.

C. Bigfork High School Levy Election Resolution – Lacey Porrovecchio asked the trustees to approve the high school levy election resolution including the amount of the general fund levy, 261,384.05.

A motion to <u>approve the Bigfork High School Levy Election Resolution</u> was made by Trustee Relyea, seconded by Trustee Whitney, and approved by unanimous vote of the elementary and high school trustees.

2020-21 Preliminary Budget Report – Lacey Porrovecchio went over the preliminary budgets for the budgeted funds for the elementary and high school districts. Trustees will adopt budgets in August.
